

## Library Hires Architect to Plan Expansion

After undergoing a four-month long selection process, the Fairfield County Library Commission has engaged the services of Danny Shelley, A.I.A., of JDMS, Inc. in Sumter to develop plans for an expansion and renovation of the Main Library in Winnsboro.

Mr. Shelley has designed and helped construct public libraries in over a dozen counties in South Carolina including Lancaster, Lexington, and Chester. He has recently renovated and expanded an old post office into a new library for the town of York and is currently the architect in charge of the renovation and expansion of the Sumter County Library. A native of Latta, South Carolina, Mr. Shelley combines experience and talent with a deep appreciation for public library service in our state.

At the end of this planning process, the library will have a site plan, a floor plan, and renderings for the public to see which we hope will communicate a vision for what public library service in Fairfield County could become in the future.

# DIRECTOR'S DESK

More books and media. More computers. Room for more children's programs. A meeting room for library and community programs. Quiet study space. Better seating. More staff work space. Longer evening and weekend hours.

These are part of our vision for how public library services in Fairfield County could look for the future.

As you have read on the front page of this newsletter, the Fairfield County Library Commission has contracted with Danny Shelley of JDMS, Inc., in Sumter to provide architectural services to help translate that vision into a design for an expanded and renovated Main Library.

The 6,000 square foot Main Library building will celebrate its 30th anniversary in 2007. It's hard to believe.

When I started as librarian and helped organize the move in 1977, the library seemed unbelievably spacious! In the intervening years the library's collection has more than doubled, including all kinds of new media such as videos, DVD's, and books on cassette and CD. The number of residents with library cards has grown from 5100 to over 13,000 and our circulation of materials has jumped from 32,696 in 1997-98 to 81,975 in 2004-05.

And, of course, we have experienced the computer revolution! Thirty years ago, no one could

have imagined automated circulation systems, online card catalogs, or public access Internet workstations.

Our building design has served us well over the years. Its open plan has allowed us to add shelving and rearrange tables and chairs to accommodate computers and new media collections. But we have reached the limits of creative rearrangement...we cannot add shelving without taking away seating and program space, and we cannot add computers without more electrical capacity.

So we are beginning to plan for the future. After considering several options, the library board decided that our current location best serves the community and that we have adequate land to expand here if we plan creatively. Over the next several months, the library board, the staff, and our architect will work toward developing a building design that will help us meet our goals for improved and expanded services. We also hope to have one or more sessions for public input during the planning process.

In the meantime, we need your help...please tell me what spaces or services **YOU** would like to see included in an expanded and renovated building. Call, write, or email...I'd love to hear from you.

# From the Friends

The guest speaker for the Friends Annual Meeting on Sunday, April 23rd, will be Warner Montgomery, owner and publisher of *The Columbia Star* newspaper.

His program will be **“The Captain and the Queen: the Lightbourn family of Farenya (Guinea) and Charleston.”**

Dr. Montgomery spent January leading an Explorers Club Expedition to Guinea where he helped conduct an archaeological survey of the village that was founded in the 1800’s by an American (Captain Lightbourn) who married an African queen and established a slave factory. Lightbourn’s brother operated a rice plantation on Wadmalaw Island and his sister was married to South Carolina Governor Thomas Bennett.

The interrelationships between this African village and South Carolina are fascinating. Dr.
