

What is the future of the book?

People often ask me whether the huge increase in ebook reading will result in the demise of the traditional book. I always answer that I hope it won't happen in my lifetime!

Librarians have been worrying about the survival of the book since the advent of television in the 1950s. Here's an interesting take on that subject from Will Manley who writes commentary on the library profession in American Libraries magazine:

"Every time someone invents a spectacular new gadget, rumors are spread that books are fast losing their popularity and may soon join the dodo, or be placed in an anti-quarian museum...

Think about it: The book has survived the phonograph, the radio, moving pictures, the reel-to-reel tape, the television, the cassette tape, the eight-track tape, the VHS and Beta videotape formats, the DVD, the CD, the iPod, the

personal computer, the Palm Pilot, the Blackberry, and the internet. Why?...The book format is indestructible...The book requires no periodic upgrades or enhancements and you can't pull the plug on it."

There is no question that the current trend is toward more digital content. The Fairfield County Library provides ebooks and other digital content to our patrons through our membership in the Jasmine Digital Library because it is our responsibility to try to meet the reading needs of our patrons in whatever formats are available. But don't expect us to abandon the traditional book any time soon...it's still the most practical and cost effective way to share content among many readers. Public libraries have always been and will always be about providing free access to literature and information...in whatever formats evolve over time.

Don't forget that the library is now lending downloadable ebooks and audiobooks! We have joined Jasmine Digital Library, a consortium of fifteen South Carolina libraries that offer digital content through Overdrive, a major vendor for public libraries.

To get started borrowing digital materials you must have a library card and pin number which can be obtained at the library. Then go to the website above

jasmine.lib.overdrive.com

and look at the "Getting Started" links in the left-hand menu...you will find instructions on how to set up your account with Jasmine. There are also links with instructions for downloading material to many different types of ebook readers, tablets, etc.
